


Todd Reed 50 YEARS SEEING MICHIGAN THROUGH A LENS



Ludington's S.S.BADGER CARFERRY

Our town is known for great beaches and the #1 state park in the Midwest, but nothing says "Ludington" more than our beloved S.S. Badger carferry.

This 410' ship carries up to 600 passengers and 180 vehicles between Ludington and Manitowoc, Wisconsin during a relaxing four-hour cruise. Passengers can play Badger Bingo, soak up some sun on the deck, or enjoy food and beverage from two restaurants and a full service bar.

The S.S. Badger is the largest carferry to ever sail the Great Lakes, and the last coal-fired passenger steamship in operation in the United States. First entered into service in 1953, the Badger was originally designed to transport railroad cars. In 1992, she was transformed into a passenger ship which also ferries vehicles and commercial trucks.

In December of 2020, the S.S. Badger was purchased by Interlake Maritime Services, a company with over a century of experience in maritime transportation. This ensures that Ludington's beloved carferry will continue to cruise Lake Michigan for years to come. $\mathring{\psi}$

Summer is the perfect time to head to a local park and feel the coolness of the grass under your bare feet. The Ludington area has 15 parks for you to enjoy.

Bring your kids and your pets there are playgrounds, picnic areas and grills at most of the parks.

Six parks are within the city limits, including Steams Park 1 and its expansive beach—and Waterfront Park 3 with its nine bronzed sculptures.

In July of 2020, a Splash Pad opened in Copeyon Park. 2 This outdoor play area has permanent sprinklers and fountains for interactive water play.


The four parks outside the city limits have beaches or Pere Marquette River access, and three out of four parks on Hamlin Lake feature boat launches. $\mathring{\psi}$

Named the #1 State Park in the Midwest, and for good reason! Within its 5,300 acres is everything you could desire in a fun and relaxing vacation. Soak up the sun in front of the Lake Michigan Beach House, tube down the Sable River, or play in the sand at Hamlin Beach. The park has an amazing diversity of terrain which can be explored while hiking shorelines, sand dunes, hardwood forests, and marshlands. Eight miles of marked trails allow you to experience wildlife in its truest form. You'll likely spot a fox or deer, and maybe an eagle soaring across the sky above.





- Lake Michigan Beach House with concessions, restrooms, veranda, outside patio, and exhibits.
- Big Sable River, which winds through the park and is a favorite place to tube.

Pick Your SCENIC TRAIL...

Skyline: .5 miles, 30 minutes walking.

This completely elevated trail features an extensive boardwalk system. From the top of the trail, view Lake Michigan and miles of sand dunes.

Sable River: 1 mile, 30 minutes walking.

This relaxing walk goes across the Hamlin Dam and can accommodate people in wheelchairs. Interpretive panels point out historic sites.

Lost Lake: 1.5 miles, 1 hour walking.

Circling a watery cove off Hamlin Lake, it loops around, beginning and ending at Hamlin Lake Beach Concessions. Wildlife is seen in abundance so keep your eyes open!

Coast Guard: 1.5 miles, 1 hour walking.

Winding through the wooded dunes from the Lake Michigan Beach, this trail has one of the earliest Life Saving Stations on Lake Michigan.

Lighthouse: 3 miles, 2 hours walking.

Starting at the Beechwood Campground, walk through rolling sand dunes and end at Big Sable Point Lighthouse. The Lighthouse Road is a shorter, 1.8 mile walk from the main entrance parking lot and can be traversed in about 40 minutes.

Logging: 3 miles, 2.5 hours walking.

This historic trail loops around, beginning and ending at the north end of the Pines Campground and features plenty of shade.

Ridge & Island: 4 miles, 3 hours walking.


The Island Trail follows the sandy shoreline of Hamlin Lake, and the Ridge Trail follows the top of a tall wooded sand dune.

South End Ski: 6 miles, 3 hours walking.

Located in the southern part of the park, these are actually three looped trails tied together. They weave through sand dune valleys of thick jack pines and wetlands.

Canoe: 2-4 hours.

Enter Hamlin Lake near the beach area. Traveling close to the south shore, enjoy swampy areas, marshlands, and wildlife.


OUR MARITIME HISTORY & LUMBERING


Ludington has such an interesting history, from its early days as a lumbering community to the many carferries that made this city their home port.

Early Settlers

James Ludington was a prominent businessman in 1854, obtaining property and running a sawmill. Naturally, our city honors James Ludington, and many of the local streets bear the names of his siblings. A drive along Ludington Avenue brings history to the forefront, as the grand homes of former lumbermen still stand today, many of which are now bed and breakfasts.

Another influential figure in Ludington's history was Justus Stearns. He started both the Stearns Lighting & Power and the Salt & Lumber Companies—and both Stearns Park and Stearns Hotel are named after him. He and his wife also opened the first hospital in town.

The Great Carferries

named the Dummy Train because of its

At one time, 13 carferries sailed in and out of Ludington's port all year, even during the winter! The carferry fleet included the Pere Marquette vessels, the City of Saginaw, City of Flint, City of Midland, S.S. Spartan-and the only one still in operation-the S.S. Badger.

These ships were built to move cargo and lumber to various ports across Lake Michigan, and today, the S.S. Badger takes passengers and their vehicles from Ludington to Manitowoc, Wisconsin. This grand ship has the honor of being on the National Register of Historic Places and is a treasure to the residents of Ludington.

Museums

The Port of Ludington Maritime Museum is in a prime location overlooking the harbor, housed in the former U.S. Coast Guard Station. View captivating and interactive exhibits, including a 110' panorama painting of Pere Marquette Lake. Listen to the words of Captain Nels Palmer through a hologram, and experience what it's like to pilot the S.S. Badger through the channel.

Historic White Pine Village, set upon 13 acres overlooking Lake Michigan, depicts how life was in Mason County during the late 1800s and early 1900s. Visit more than 30 buildings, with many originals that were preserved and moved to the village, including the first Mason County Courthouse. The gift shop offers locally made syrups and jams, and be sure to buy an ice cream cone at the Old Fashioned Ice Cream Parlor. $\mathring{\psi}$

OUTDOOR Life IN LUDINGTON

While visiting Ludington, you'll want to take advantage of all we have to offer. We're known for our lighthouses and the S.S. Badger, but here's a sampling of other things to do during your stay.

Great Outdoors

This is where you want to be to take in the fresh air, get some exercise, and appreciate the beauty of the area. We're blessed with three golf courses right here in Ludington-or play different versions such as mini golf and disc golf-both popular with families. There are numerous hiking and biking trails within the city, most notably east of Sherman and north of Bryant, where dogs are welcome on the 2.75 mile trail. Head down the road to Cartier Park, which also has paved surfaces. Or experience the Waterfront Loop, which takes you from Stearns Park, past the Coast Guard Station and Maritime Museum, through both marinas and

Waterfront Park. You can also bike from town out to the Ludington State Park along M-116, and once inside the park, you'll find 1.5 miles of paved bike paths through exhilarating wooded terrain.

Boating and fishing are so much fun here, whether you're on Lake Michigan or Hamlin Lake. Depending on the month, you can fish for trout, salmon, steelhead, bluegill and crappie. Don't have your own boat? No worries—there are local businesses that rent pontoons, fishing boats, kayaks, canoes and jet skis. Access Lake Michigan from the Loomis Street ramp, Upper Hamlin Lake from Victory and Wilson Hill Parks, and Lower Hamlin from South Bayou Park or inside the Ludington State Park.

Camping is bigger than ever now, and the Ludington area has numerous campgrounds for you to park your RV





or pitch a tent. Choose a site near a lake or in one of our quiet, wooded areas. It's a fun and economical way to travel.

Take the kids to Copeyon Park off south Washington Avenue and let them play in the Splash Pad. They will love this clean, safe water activity and you will enjoy the view of Pere Marquette Lake.

Downtown

Stroll the three blocks of downtown Ludington and the five blocks of south James Street to discover all the quaint shops that are worth exploring. The newly-renovated Legacy Plaza is a lovely place to relax and features a covered market, seating area, a fire-pit and an urban green space. During the summer, an outdoor Farmer's Market is held here on Fridays.

Satisfy your hunger at many downtown restaurants now offering outside dining and take-out services. Selected restaurants participate in the new Ludington Outdoor Social District (LOSD) which allows you to

purchase an alcoholic beverage to enjoy outside within the designated area.

Waterfront Park is Ludington's pride and joy. Let the kids play on the expansive playground while you appreciate the nine bronzed sculptures throughout the park. This is also the perfect place to watch the S.S. Badger sail into port. $\mathring{\mathbb{T}}$

Find the Light BIG SABLE POINT LIGHTHOUSE



Located within the Ludington State Park, the Big Sable Point Lighthouse (or Grande Point au Sable as the French called it) is most recognized by its black and white tower. It stands 112 feet tall, with 130 steps winding to the top for a magnificent view.

Constructed in 1867, it protected mariners with light which was visible 19 miles into Lake Michigan. In 1949, Big Sable Point became the last Great Lakes light to be electrified, and automation of the light eliminated the need for a keeper. The former keeper's quarters is now a gift shop.

Big Sable Point Lighthouse is listed on the state and national registers of historic places. $\mathring{\mathbb{T}}$



THE **Power** of Ludington

Driving into Ludington along US-31, one can't help but notice the white wind turbines to the east and a steep, grassy hillside to the west. Lake Winds Energy Park and the Ludington Pumped Storage Plant play an important role in the community, and they're also fascinating places to visit.

Ludington Pumped Storage Plant

Built between 1969-1973, the Pumped Storage Plant is a 27-billion gallon water reservoir that is 2.5 miles long, one mile wide and 110' deep. During the evening water is taken in from Lake Michigan and pumped uphill through large penstocks to the reservoir. In the daytime the reservoir releases the water to flow back downhill through the penstocks. The flowing water causes the turbines to turn in the powerhouse and electricity is generated. You can get a close-up view of the 842 acre Ludington Pumped Storage Plant from the observation deck by driving south on Lakeshore Drive off Pere Marguette

Highway.

Lake Winds Energy Park

The 56 wind turbines that make up Lake Winds Energy Park first became operational in November 2012. Each turbine is 476' in height, providing 100 megawatts of energy. They sit on 16,000 acres of farmland south of Ludington and are owned by Consumers Energy. The location was chosen partly due to the positive wind force off Lake Michigan. Wind power is seen by some to be the energy source of the future and helps offset emissions of carbon dioxide and greenhouse gases. 🕆

This expansive beach, right at the end of Ludington Avenue, has restrooms, accessible walkways, concessions, and picnic area. You are free to set up chairs anywhere on the beach, hold your ceremony, then clean up immediately after. Tents or canopies are not allowed, and no permits are required.

Buttersville Beach & Summit Park

Located south of Ludington, these beaches are a bit more private and no tents may be erected but chairs are fine. There is no permit needed to exchange vows on Buttersville Beach.

Summit Park

This park has a pavilion (holds up to 75) that can be rented for a small fee, and includes 40 folding chairs, six long tables, stove, microwave, and refrigerator for use.

Ludington State Park




Spring
